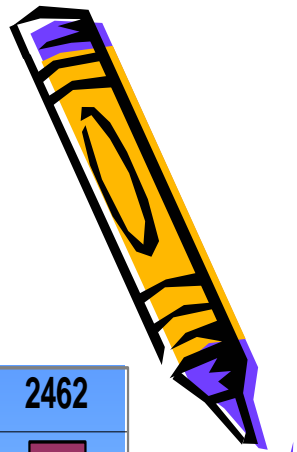
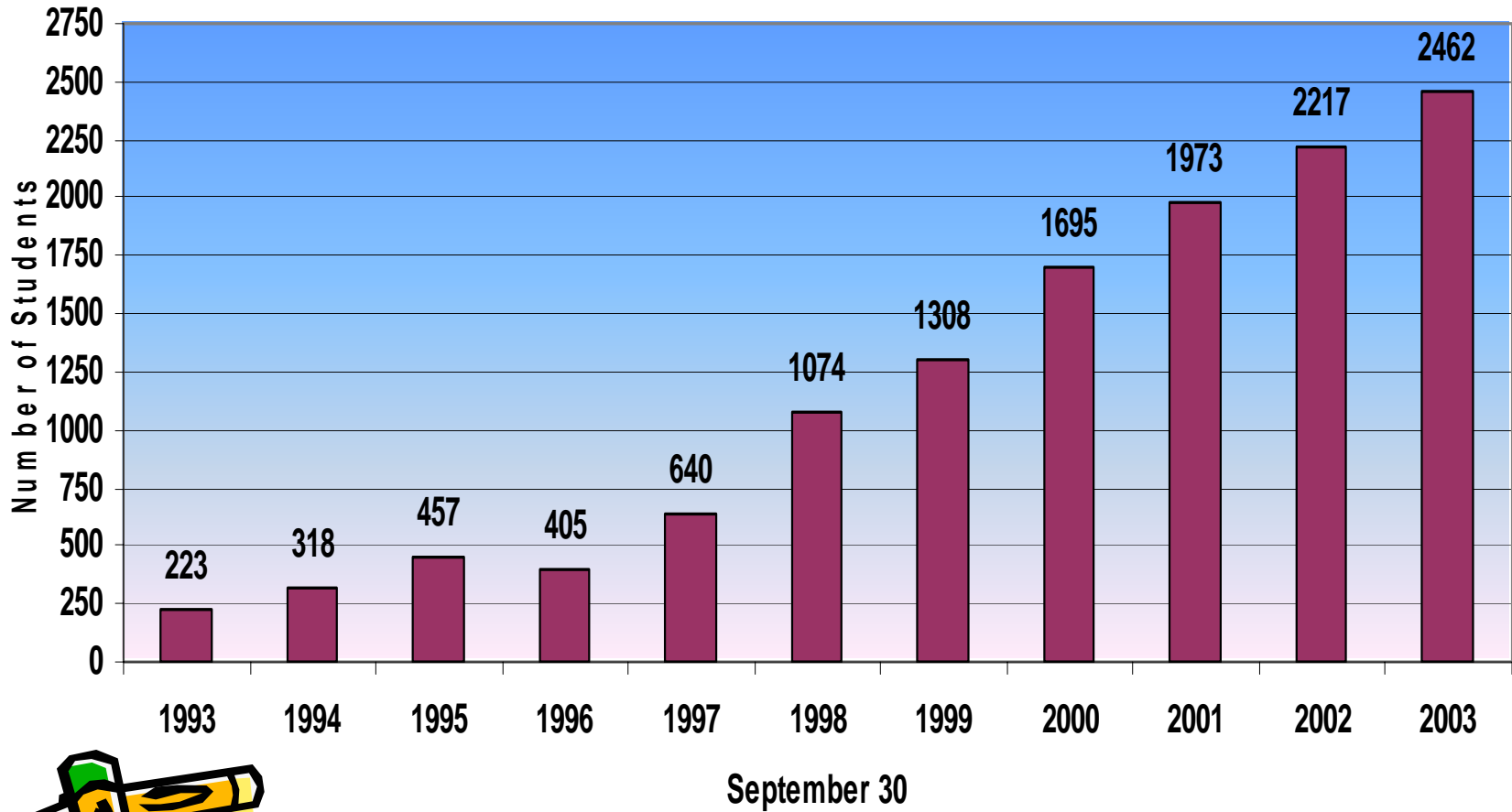
District Enrollment



Special Education Enrollment (ERC, SLP-A and SLP-B)

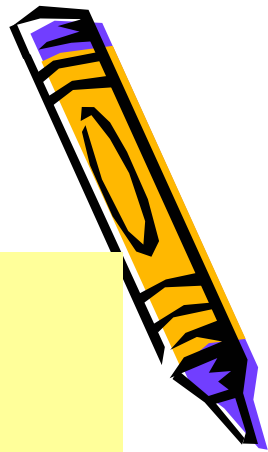
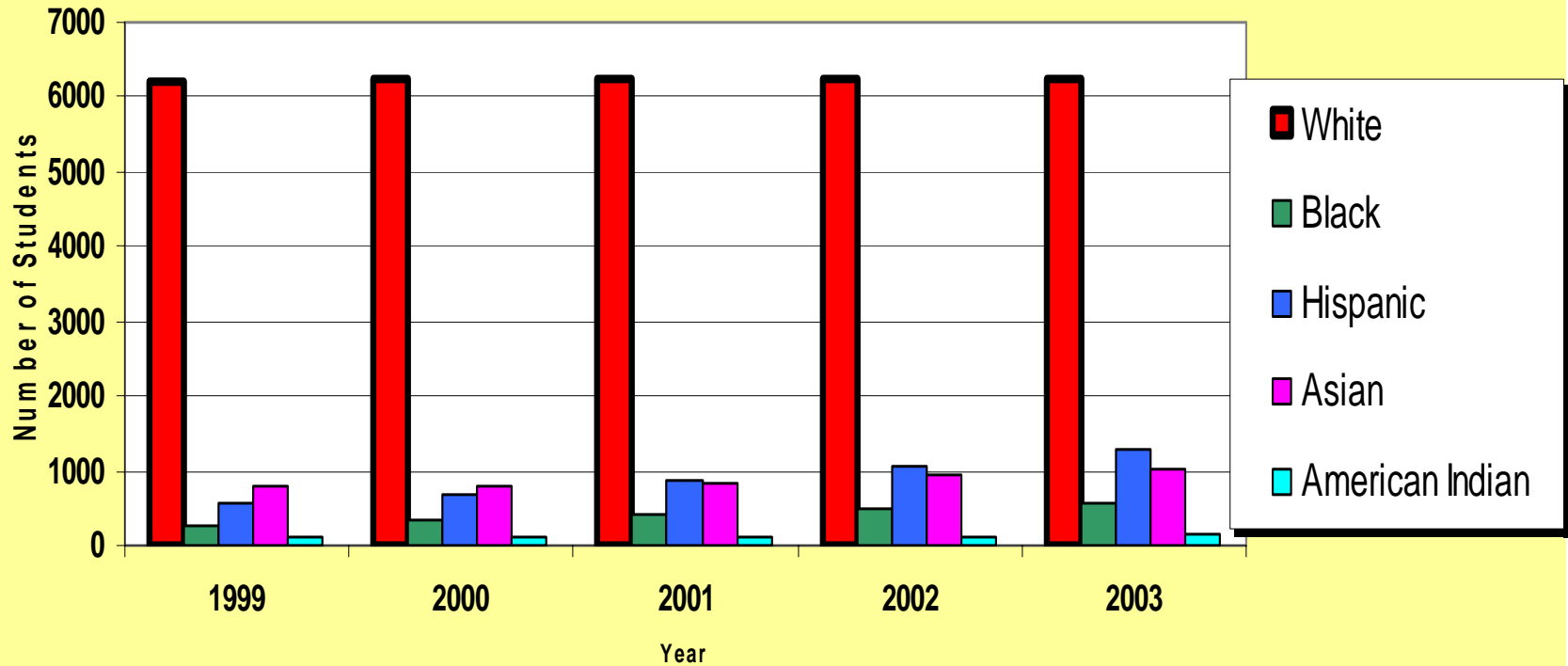


ESL Student Enrollment Count

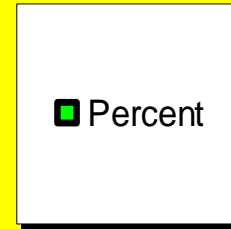
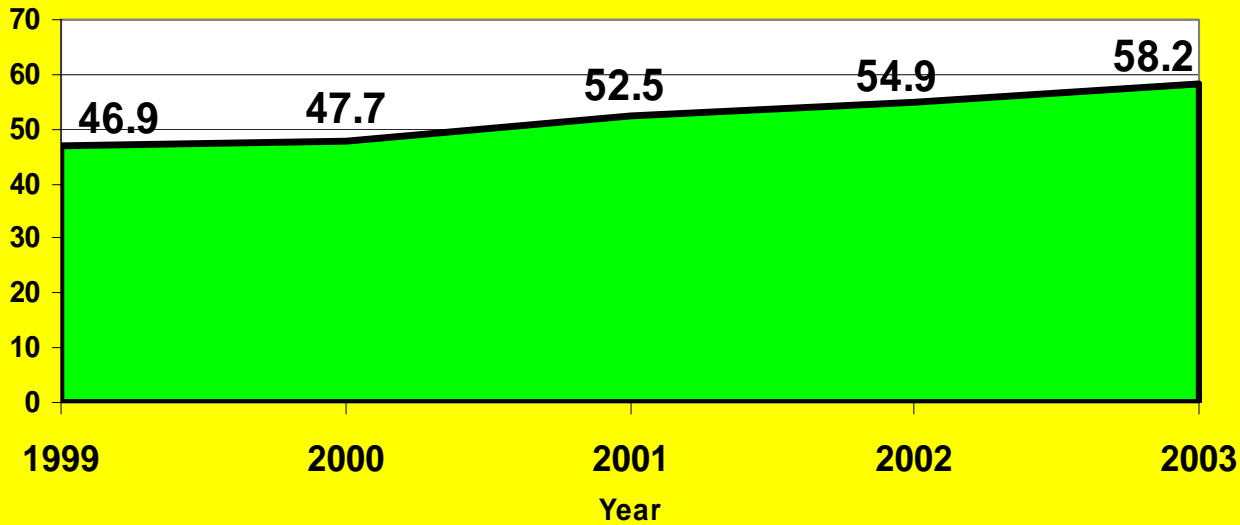
District Enrollment by Ethnicity

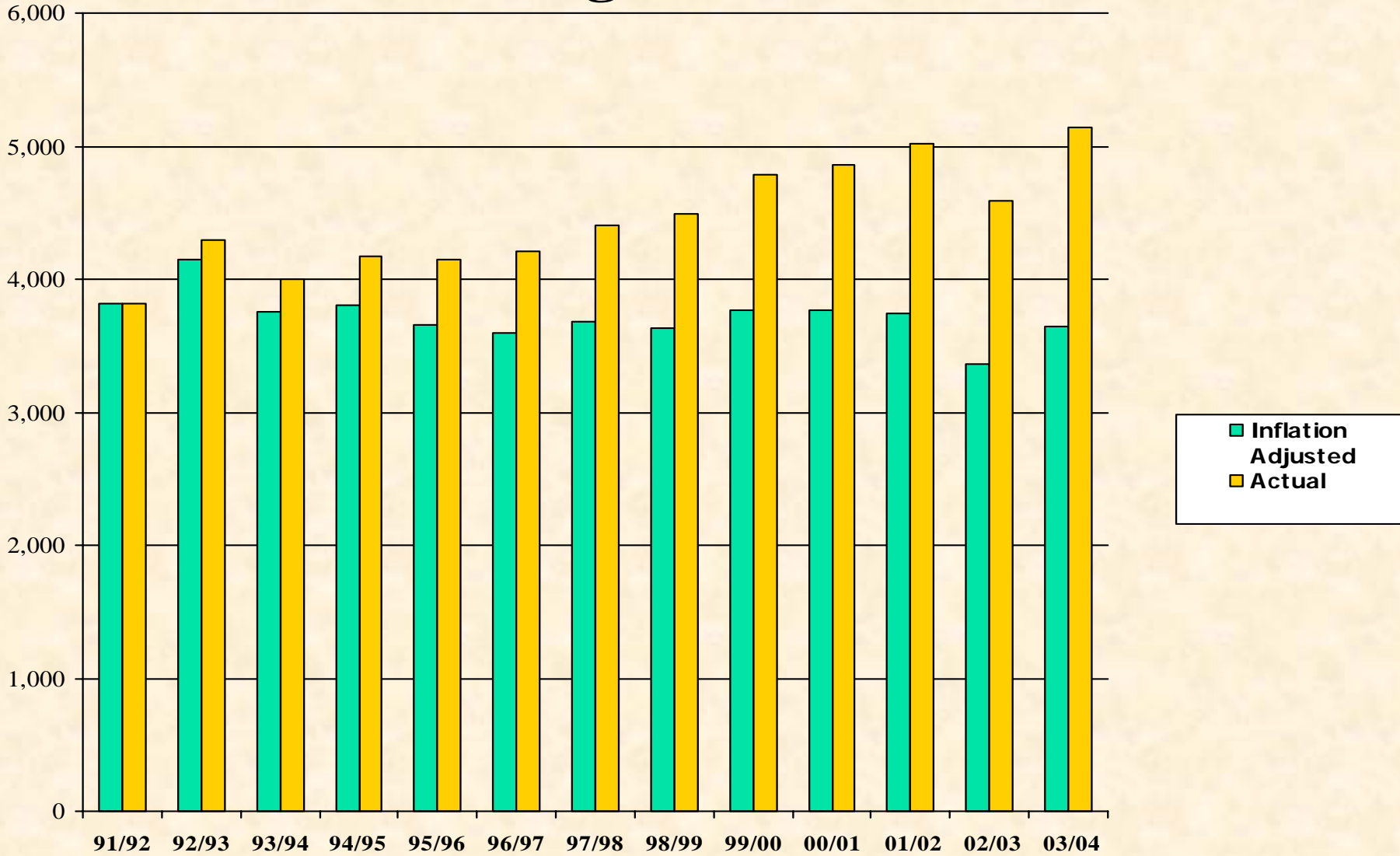

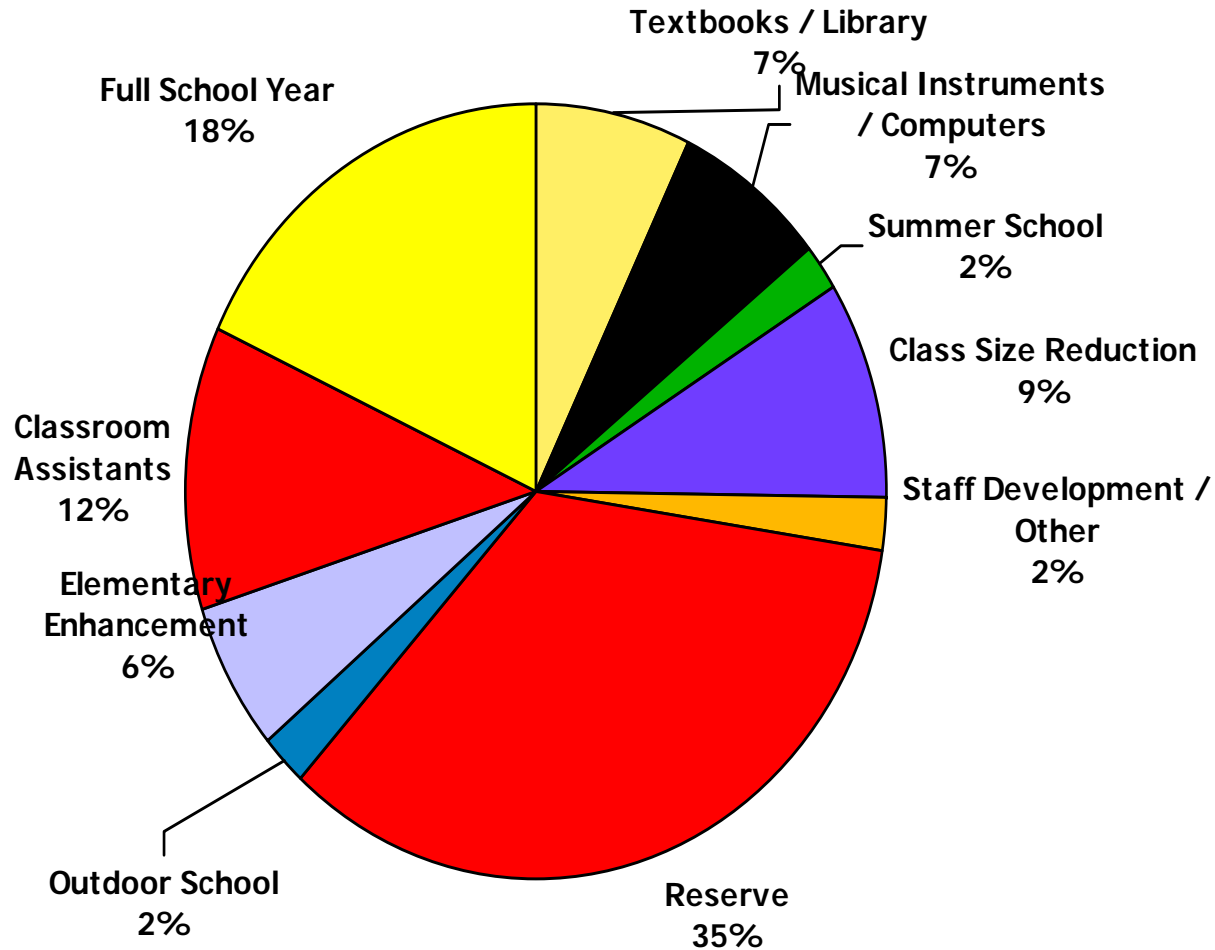

Funding Vs. Inflation

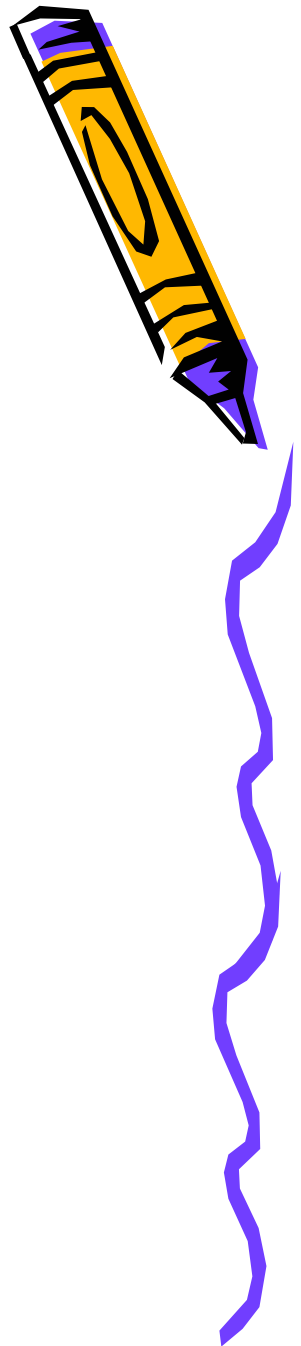


Use of ITAX (as a percentage of total)

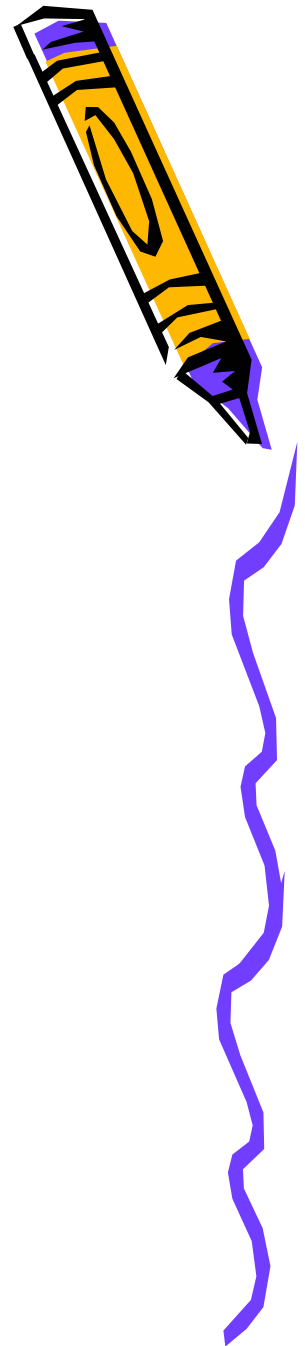

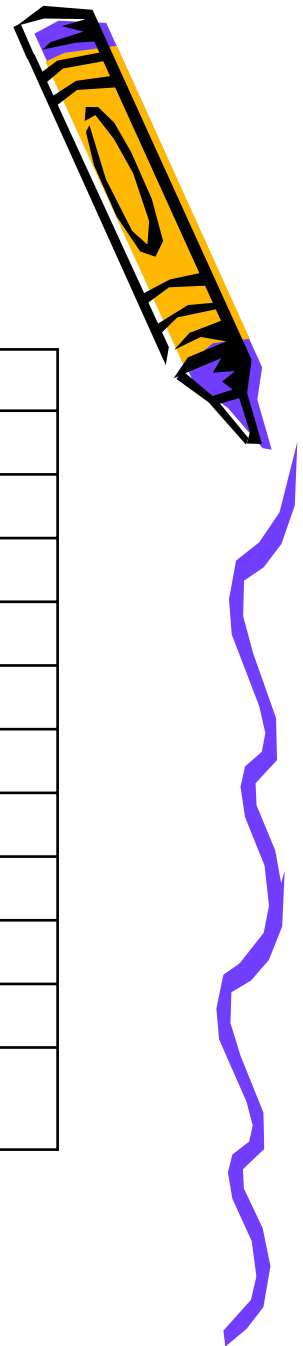

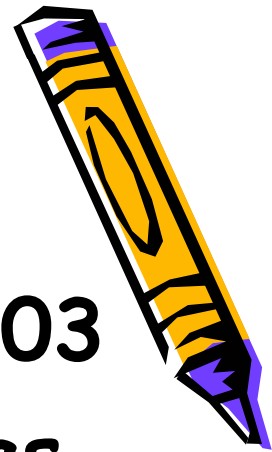
Student Achievement



- District-wide student achievement is improving, but assessment scores hover below state averages except in grade 8 math and grade 10 math problem solving which exceed the state average



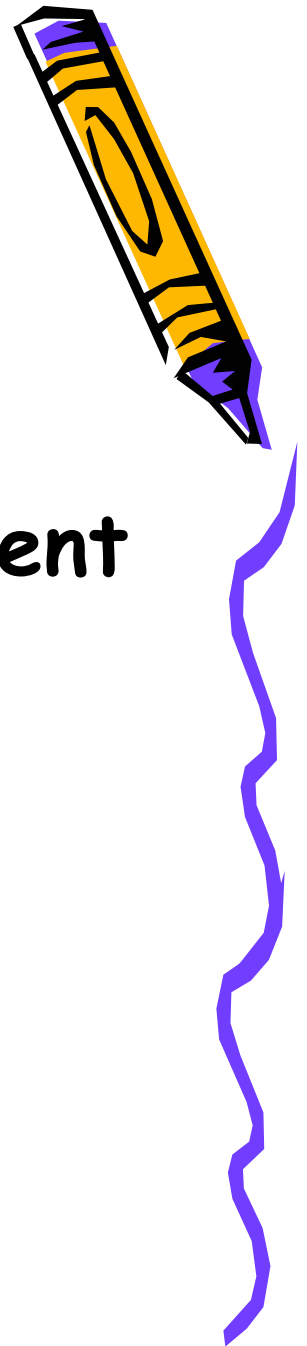
Student Achievement



- Dropout rate was 2.9% in 2002-03
- Attendance rate for 2002-03 was 93.9%, slightly above the state average
- Over 80% of David Douglas High School graduates enroll in post-secondary education compared to 56% in 1991



Student Achievement



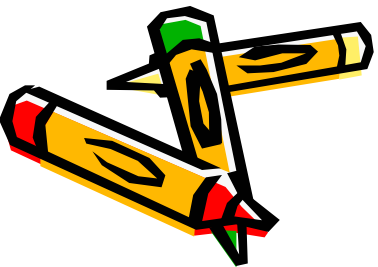
- All subgroups, except special education, met student achievement and participation expectations under NCLB for 2001-02 and 2002-03



Student Achievement Plans for Improvement



- Extended year programs offered for all students, K-12, in summer 2004
- Reading coaches assigned to all elementary schools to encourage reading competency by grade 3



Student Achievement Plans for Improvement



- 21st Century grants are funding after school academic support in all secondary schools and three elementary schools
- Two elementary schools have SUN Schools programs



Student Achievement Plans for Improvement

- All elementary teachers are being trained in Guided Language Acquisition Design (GLAD) instructional methods to accelerate literacy performance for English Language Learners. Secondary teachers are also participating in staff development activities to increase their ability to work with ELL students



Student Achievement Plans for Improvement



- Grade 4 and 5 students who need additional assistance in reading are receiving an additional hour of instruction every week using technology



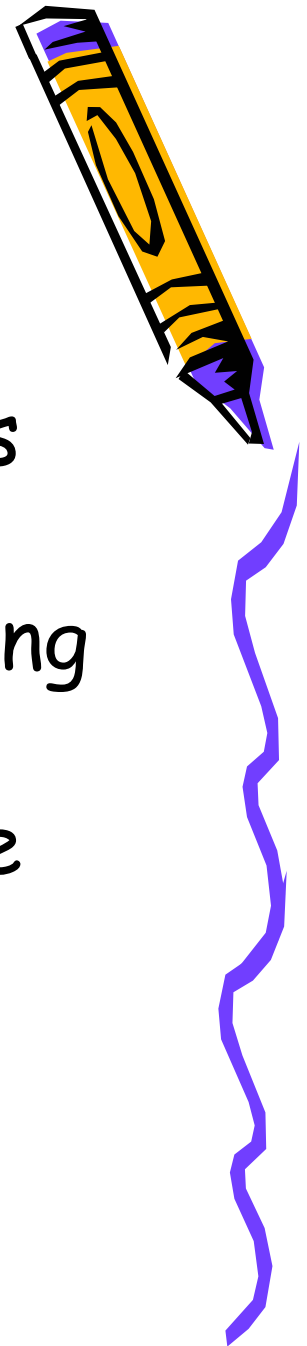
Efficiency Improvements



- Citizen involvement in budget development is promoted
- Reserve fund contributes to stability
- Central administration reduced
- Buildings used to capacity to reduce overhead costs



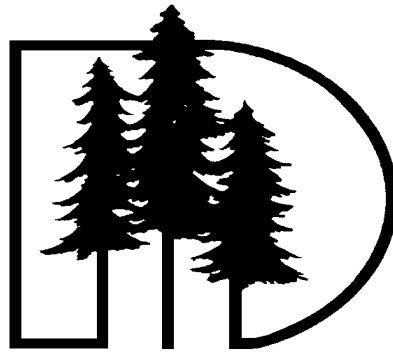
Efficiency Improvements



- Choice programs help balance class size
